Dear Senators Hassan and Scott, and Representatives Kennedy and Nunn,

The Mental Health Liaison Group (MHLG), a coalition of national organizations representing people with mental health and substance use disorders, family members, mental health and addiction providers, advocates, and other stakeholders, is committed to strengthening Americans' access to behavioral health care. We write to express our strong support for the *Occupational Therapy Mental Health Parity Act*, bipartisan legislation expanding access to occupational therapy (OT) services for individuals with mental health and substance use disorders under Medicare.

Although Medicare currently permits coverage of OT services for any individual with a mental health or substance use disorder, many beneficiaries face persistent barriers to accessing this care. Occupational therapy practitioners are often underutilized in behavioral health settings due to limited awareness and inconsistent recognition of their role in addressing these specific health needs. This bill would help address these challenges by directing the Secretary of Health and Human Services to conduct outreach and provide education to clarify existing coverage and billing procedures for OT services under Medicare.

Occupational therapy is already delivered in a range of mental and behavioral health settings—including community mental health centers, certified community behavioral health clinics, partial hospitalization programs, assertive community treatment (ACT) teams, shelters, and correctional facilities—where its holistic, functional approach improves daily living skills, psychological well-being, and quality of life. The education and clarification provided by the *Occupational Therapy Mental Health Parity Act* would ensure Medicare beneficiaries have access to OT's person-centered care, while helping address the nation's behavioral health workforce shortage.

We thank you for your leadership in introducing this important legislation and look forward to working with you to advance it in Congress.
